

Study Abroad Committee

Students about to study abroad give the chair of this committee descriptions from the abroad institution of the math courses they are signed up for (or in some circumstances, have already taken).

The study abroad committee then decides for each course whether it is so close to one of our courses (say math 441) that taking it should give them credit for that course. If the answer is negative, it is then decided whether the course should simply count as a course taken at a certain level (say the 300 level) and the level is duly recorded together with any appropriate comments.

There is some paper work to be filled out, and the student frequently but not always chats with the chair about the which courses to take, for bureaucratic or even mathematical reasons.
